on many different roles within Development which include working with young players in Hong Kong, skill development with the London Nationals and London Jr Knights AAA Organizations, as well as 1 on 1 sessions with players in all stages of their hockey careers.

Welcome back Brandon Buck to our development team for the 25/26 season.

Following three years in the Ontario Hockey League as an undrafted free agent, Brandon signed his first professional contract with the Houston Aeros, the American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate for the Minnesota Wild.

After two successful years in the AHL, Brandon accepted an opportunity to continue his professional hockey career in Europe. He proceeded to play for nine years with a wide variety of European teams, including the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL) in Germany, The National (NLA/NLB) Leagues in Switzerland, and the Erste Bank Eishockey Liga (EBEL) League in Austria.

A career highlight for Brandon was participating in two Spengler Cup tournaments for the host HC Davos and the Nurnberg Ice Tigers. Additionally, he also represented Hockey Canada three times on the international stage, in both Germany and Russia.

Currently, Brandon is continuing his career with the Strathroy Jets.
